





Remember When....

Before our independents, TarTan had held their specialty with an all breed show, almost always in CT. One year we decided that it might be nice to have the specialty with an all breed show in MA to allow our more northern members an easier trip.

The year was 1984 and the TarTan GSC Specialty was to be held with the Ladies Dog Club All Breed show in Wellesly, MA.. The all breed club welcomed us with a big ring shaded by lovely oak trees and a large tenting area adjacent to the ring. Beautiful grounds, a summer weekend, a good entry....little did we know that those lovely show grounds were soon to become 'waterfront' property.

Most of us got to the grounds and had our crates unloaded under the tent before the deluge began...It rained so hard and vicious that the ground UNDER the tent was soon inches deep in run off water. People began stacking their crates so their dogs could be on the second level, as water was soon rushing through the bottom crates. By the time the specials were ready to go into the ring, the mud was ankle deep and the tents were starting to buckle with the accumulated rainwater. In any case, we soon had to face the fact that we were headed for the Group later on in the afternoon.

Ah the good old days....kind of refreshing isn't it?

There was no hope for my shoes and my Best of Breed picture will forever go down in posterity as that of a soaking wet Gordon Setter with a big grin on his face and a string of slobber hanging from his chin, a handler with one shoe, torn stockings and raindrops dripping from her glasses and a judge with mud splattered up to his knees trying his best not to have that darn slobber touch him!

A Dog's Eye view of Obedience Class

HEEL ON LEAD: Walk as slowly as you can, then spring forward with all your weight. If your handler falls flat on his or her face, you score 25 points.

RECALL: When your handler shouts at you, assume rock deafness. On no account sit in front of your handler, because he will only make you heel.

25 points if your handler loses his voice.

RETRIEVE the DUMBBELL: On no account fetch it back, because he will only throw it away again. If he wants the stupid piece of wood let him fetch it himself, you will be helping to train him not to throw away things he really wants. 5 points every time the handler gets the dumbbell.

SIT: Stay one inch away from the ground at the back end. This builds muscles and makes your rear legs stronger, which will help you pull your handler down on the HEEL ON LEAD.

TarTan Bylaws 1; ARTICLE IV-CLUB YEAR, VOTING NOMINATIONS AND FLECTIONS SECTION I. Club Year.

 a) Fiscal Year. The Club's fiscal year shall begin on the 1st day of July and end on the last day of June next following.

(b) Installation of Board of Directors: The elected Officers and members of the Board of Directors shall take office immediately following the election and each retiring officer shall turn over to his successor in office all properties and records relating to that office within 30 days after the election.

SECTION 2. Voting. At the Annual Meeting, Regular Club Meetings or at a Special Club Meeting voting shall be limited to those voting members in good standing who are present at the meeting, except for the election of Officers and Directors and amendments to the constitution and bylaws which shall be decided by secret written ballot. Voting by proxy shall not be permitted. The Board of Directors may decide to submit other specific questions for decision of the members by written ballot by mail.

SECTION 3. Nominations, Elections and Ballots. No person may be a candidate in a club election who has not been nominated in accordance with these bylaws. A Nominating Committee shall be chosen by the Board of Directors not later than the first day of February. The Committee shall consist of five members and two alternates none of which shall be candidates for office. All members and alternates on the committee shall be voting members in good standing, no more than two of which may be members of the current Board of Directors. The Board shall name a chairman for the Committee. The Nominating Committee shall be responsible for the conduct and preparations necessary in the case of a contested election. The Nominating Committee may conduct its business by mail, electronic medium or telephone conference call.

(a) The Nominating Committee shall nominate from among the eligible members of the Club, one candidate for each office and for each position on the Board of Directors and shall procure the acceptance of each nominee -if so chosen. The Committee should consider geographical representation of the membership on the Board to the extent that it is practicable to do so. The Committee, not later than March 1 next following, shall then submit its slate of candidates to the Secretary, who shall have said report published in the following Newsletter, so that additional nominations may be made by the members if they so desire.

(b) Additional nominations of eligible members may be made by written petition signed by five voting members in good standing and accompanied by the written acceptance of each such additional nominee signifying his willingness to be a candidate and a brief resume outlining the nominee's qualifications. Such nominations from members must be received by the Secretary not later than April 15 next following. No person shall be a candidate for more than one position.

(c) If no valid additional nominations are received by, the Secretary on or before April 15, the Nominating Committee's slate shall be declared elected, effective at the annual meeting by means of the Secretary casting a single vote for the election of the unopposed, slate. No further balloting will be required,

(d) If one or more valid additional nominations are received, by the Secretary, on or before April 15th, the Secretary, or an independent professional firm designated by the Board) shall, cause to be published in the May edition of the Club's newsletter a listing all of the nominees for each position, in alphabetical order, along with a brief resume of the candidates qualifications.

(e) In the event of a contested slate of candidates, the election of Officers and Directors shall be held at the annual meeting by secret ballot. The time allotted for the election shall be published in the newsletter prior to the annual meeting and shall provide sufficient time to allow all members wishing to vote, to do so. The nominating committee shall be responsible for the conduct of the election, the preparations necessary and shall serve as an election committee as listed herein. Ballots must be clear and impartial with the candidates listed in alphabetical order in each office section of the ballot. Members will be checked against the current list of voting members, as provided by the membership chairperson, given a ballot to be marked and shall return the ballot to be placed in a ballot collection box. Ballots shall be counted once each member has had the opportunity to vote. Once the voting has been closed at the annual meeting no more votes may be accepted. Those voting members not able to attend the annual meeting may request an absentee ballot from the nominating chairperson not later than 30 days prior to the annual meeting. Said absentee ballot shall be the same ballot as will be used by members attending the annual meeting. Dual envelope procedures shall be followed for all absentee ballots. The Nominating Chairperson shall provide a ballot, together with a blank envelope and a return envelope addressed to the nominating chairperson marked "Ballot". So that the ballots may remain secret, each voter, after marking their ballot shall place and seal the ballot in the blank envelope which in turn is then placed in the return envelope. Each voting member must then legibly sign the outside of the return envelope. Absentee ballots must be received by mail prior to the date of the annual meeting to be valid. The nominating Chairperson shall then carry the ballots unopened to the annual meeting. Absentee ballots shall be checked against the current list of voting members and the list of members who voted in person at the annual meeting. Once the ballots are checked for privilege and duplication, they shall be removed from the outer envelopes by the nominating chairperson, who then gives the ballots in the blank envelopes to one of the other election committee members, who shall remove the ballots from the blank envelopes and place them in the ballot collection box to be counted along with the ballots cast by the members voting at the annual meeting. Voting shall be restricted to those voting members in good Standing with the Club as of the date of the Annual meeting. The ballots shall be counted by a committee of at least three persons and shall be chaired by the nominating chairperson; no person who is a candidate for office shall serve on the election committee. The results of the election shall be announced at the annual meeting and published in the following month's newsletter. (f) The nominated candidate receiving the greatest number of votes for each office shall be declared elected. In the case of a tie for any office the Board of Directors, by a majority vote, shall determine the issue or may call for a runoff election in the undecided slot. If any nominee, at the time of the election, is unable to serve for any reason, such nominee shall not be elected and the vacancy so created shall be filled by the new Board of Directors in the manner provided by Article 111, Section 5.
